## MORRIS REMEMBERS THOSE WHO HAVE SERVED DURING VETERANS DAY CEREMONY

MORRIS – On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, the Morris Color Guard posted the colors to open the Veterans Day observance on the Grundy County Courthouse lawn to remember veterans of every generation.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Ken Buck, Commander of the Morris American Legion recognized those who were former prisoners of war (POW) and those still missing in action.

"This serves as a reminder for all of us who've spared no effort to secure the release of any American prisoner from captivity, the repatriation of the remains of those who died bravely in defense of liberty, and the full accounting of those missing. We ask that we rededicate ourselves to this vital endeavor," Buck said.

"I looked up the Department of Defense's POW and MIA accounting just today, and currently the United States of America still lists over 81,500

POW-MIA's still unaccounted for," He said.

Veterans Day began as Armistice Day in recognition of the anniversary of the signing of the armistice that ended World War I. In 1954, the name of the holiday was changed to honor all veterans of all wars.

After remarks from Disabled American Veterans Chapter 86, and The Forty & Eight Local 1195, it was time for the laying of the wreaths. They were carried by the Daughters of the American Revolution, the American Legion Auxiliary, VFW Auxiliary, and the Gold Star Mothers and Families.

Cher de Gare Jerry Terando spoke on behalf of The Forty & Eight Local 1195 and Gold Star Mothers and Families, to honor his son Sgt. Joshua A. Terando, and those who have died in combat.

"With POW and MIA's there is no celebration, there is no joy. Some have been repatriated, either alive or their remains, and some continue to be missing. For those families there's no closure, so always keep them in your thoughts and prayers," Terando said.

"For the Goldstar families, I'd like to leave this wreath. Yesterday, marked 17 years that our son was killed in Iraq. It's always a somber time of

year for us and there's a lot of what we know whose sons did return and those who have returned many times – it's a terrible situation and there is no closure for a lot of families," he said.

Buck closed out the ceremony with a reminder that Veterans Day is a day to recognize all men and women who have served in the United States military and many of them return home and continue to serve.

"Gravery and dedication to community are common amongst veterans. Today is a day to honor that. Many have continued to serve their communities as first responders, teachers, healthcare workers, church leaders, some our business owners, farmers, company workers, and retirees," Buck said.

"Many veterans continue to pay a high price for their military service. It is up to us to ensure they always have access to high-quality health care and benefits, reflecting thanks of a grateful nation," he said.

After a moment of silence for all lost comrades, the ceremony came to a close with the Morris Color Guard performing the salute.

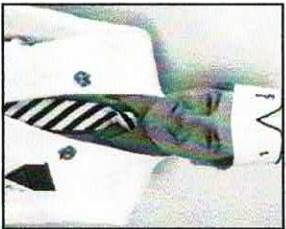
## LIGHTWEIGHT TEAMS OF THE MORRIS WARRIORS FOOTBALL

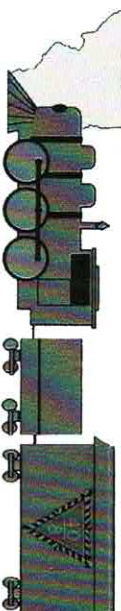

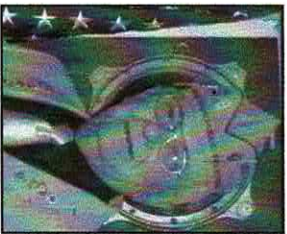

Greetings from Volture Nationale! The more we seek to be uncomfortable to change, the more comfortable we will be to be and seek, that change. Let that sink in. Obviously, this week some stepped out of the comfort zone and asked and recruited fourteen new members! I thank each person who asked and recruited a new member. Congratulations to West Virginia for reaching 106.36 membership goal. The numbers turned in this wee was 715. If for the next eight weeks that number was turned in we would make 2023 membership goal and objective.

This past week I sent out a survey to 230 voyageurs from across the country. 98 percent responded they would refer and ask a veteran to join. In other comments, 80 percent responding said they like to see things in the newspaper, and reading "in the know" information. The "print" of newspapers and magazines is not dead. Additional comments included, 90 percent of those responding said they appreciate the help from the National Membership team. 75 percent responded with, we as an organization do not target the outside community. Veterans are everywhere, grocery stores, clothing stores, shopping malls, restaurants of all kinds. Veterans, their children, grandchildren, nieces, and nephews to name a few, are all at high schools, universities, and technical schools. So, I ask this month you seriously look at the areas you have been targeting in your community. How many of you have put flyers of a pancake feed to benefit the nurses training scholarship program, in a local veteran building and expected people all around the community to know of the event and how that event will benefit veterans and will be happy to attend? Are you taking advantage of every tool available in your community. Have you approached your local newspaper, invited the local college, or contracted the local radio station for a small fee to announce a PSA (public service announcement)? Target the audience we have not been targeting in our pursuit of membership.

I echo Chef de Chemin de Fer Frank Kronen, "communication is key", I spoke with Chief Kronen as he was getting ready to travel to California. He shared with me he always has a type of informational brochure a business card, and has on some type of 4088 at the project hat.

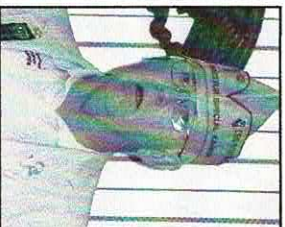

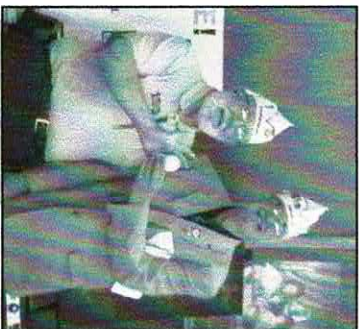
as fully qualified Registered Nurses. Kaskaskia College nursing graduates typically remain in the local area to practice in area medical facilities and raise their families.
